

Use a fluoride toothpaste when you brush your teeth twice a day (the brand does not matter).

Children aged 0-3 should be using a smear of toothpaste that contains at least 1000ppm of fluoride (a smear is a thin layer of toothpaste).

Children over the age of 3 should be using toothpaste that contains 1450ppm of flouride, only use a pea size amount of toothpaste, they do not have to use a special children's toothpaste, the family toothpaste is fine as long as it contains 1450ppm fluoride.

Fluoride helps to prevent tooth decay, it strengthens the tooth enamel and can be found in toothpaste and in some mouthwashes.

Remember: Brush, spit and do not rinse the mouth.

It is best not to wash away the tooth paste, this will give the fluoride time to work on the enamel.

YEAR 1 PHONICS SCREENING CHECK WORKSHOP

This term we held a parent meeting all about the Phonics Screening Check which is a test for children in Year 1. Children take it during June in a one-to-one setting with a teacher. They are given 40 words to read, 20 real words and 20 alien words. They must use their phonic knowledge to decode and blend these words accurately. The children are constantly practising their sounds at school and regularly take part in practice tests.

CELLO MASTERCLASS

This half term some of the Year 4 children were very lucky to have a cello master class with the secondary cello music teacher. They learnt about the history of the cello and the traditional music which is played on it. They also learnt how the cello is very adaptable and it is used in many modern pieces of music too. The children were very excited to get to play the instrument as well, learning how to hold it correctly and to use a bow.



ORAL HEALTH SESSIONS

On Friday 28th January 2022, Nursery, Reception and Year 1 were very lucky to have Adele Francois speak to us via zoom, who is the Oral Health promoter for the borough of Ealing. She took the time to speak to us about how important our teeth are and what will happen to our teeth as we grow up. We learnt 3 main facts about keeping our teeth healthy:

 Brush your teeth for two minutes twice a day with a fluoride toothpaste

 Have a balanced diet and learn the importance of cutting down on how often you have sugary foods and drinks

•Visit the dentist regularly, as often as they recommend





YEAR 2 SATS WORKSHOP

This term we held a parent workshop about the 'Year 2, End of KS1 SATS' which take place in May. Children will sit the following tests.

-Reading (2 papers).

-Mathematics (2 papers).

-English grammar, punctuation and spelling (2 papers)

The children will have been preparing for these tests throughout their learning in school and will be familiar with them. It will provide teachers with a great evaluation of how your child is progressing.



YEAR 2 DICTIONARY CHALLENGE:


This half term Year 2 have been learning how to use a dictionary to further their learning.

MATHS MASTERCLASS AT THE ROYAL INSTITUTE!

This term, a selection of children from Year 5 have attended a Maths Masterclass, on Saturdays, at the Royal Institute in Central London. The Masterclasses were a series of workshops where students explored mathematics and computer science outside the confines of the classroom, through hands-on extra-curricular workshops. Each week, they met with workshop leaders who shared their expertise and passion through interactive project work. The children's participation was rewarded with a certificate and there will also be Celebration Events for all attendees of the Masterclasses on Saturday 9th July 2022 at the Royal Institution.



END OF KS2 SATS WORKSHOP

This half term, the year 6 team held a parent workshop to discuss the End of KS2 SATs scheduled for the beginning of May and what parents and carers could do to support their child.

The end of KS2 SATs consist of the following tests:

Paper	Time
English Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling (GPS) Paper 1	45 minutes
English Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling (GPS) Paper 2	Approximately 15 minutes
English Reading	1 hour
Mathematics Paper 1: Arithmetic	30 minutes
Mathematics Paper 2: Reasoning	40 minutes
Mathematics Paper 3: Reasoning	40 minutes
	English Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling (GPS) Paper 1 English Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling (GPS) Paper 2 English Reading Mathematics Paper 1: Arithmetic Mathematics Paper 2: Reasoning

The children have been preparing for these tests throughout their learning this school year and will be familiar with the format of each of the assessments. In addition to what the year 6 staff are doing in school to support the pupils, there are a few things pupils could be doing at home to help them be prepared for the tests.

What can I do to help my child be ready for the test?

•Ensure pupils are secure with their times tables. Pupils all have a login to TT (times tables) Rockstars and should be practising this regularly.

•Pupils should be reading at home, with an adult, for at least 20 minutes a day. In every pupil's reading record, you will be able to find question stems to help support you with questioning your child's understanding of what they have read.

•Encourage pupils to complete the homework that is sent home weekly and over half term holidays – this homework has been designed to cover specific misconceptions in pupils learning.

Ensure pupils are in school on time and every day. Unlike assessment weeks, if pupils miss one of their SATs papers, there is no opportunity to resit the test at a later date.

•Ensure pupils get enough sleep and have breakfast before coming to school.

- Create posters to help advertise the event
- Work together to prepare for the day.
- Do a shared write of a letter to send out to parents about the day

EXPLORING VEHICLES THROUGH CROSS PHASE LINKS

This half term in Design and Technology lessons the year 2 pupils have been learning all about Vehicles. They have experimented building the chassis, axle, and wheels of a car, learnt new vocabulary and discussed why different vehicles are designed for a purpose. To conclude our unit, the pupils visited the secondary school and took part in a practical lesson where they built cars out of wood. These sessions were led by Mr Spiller and Mr Flynn the secondary D&T teachers. The pupils enjoyed these lessons!
