

MINI FIRST AID

On Thursday 6th January, we were really fortunate to have a company come into to our school called 'Mini First Aid' and work with our year six pupils. In the 1-hour session, Children learnt to deal with bumps, burns, breaks and bleeding, carry out CPR and deal with choking. The class was practical and really hands on. As a result of this session the children have learnt basic first aid skills that they can use for life!









White Rose Maths has recently launched their new 1-Minute Maths app. This app helps KS1 children build greater number confidence and fluency. It's all about targeted practice in engaging, one-minute chunks! Your child can choose any topic they want to try. They then answer a unique series of questions (so it's a different set of questions every time). If they're struggling with a question, a 'Hint' button will give a helpful clue by showing the question in a different but familiar way. When the one minute's up, they'll see a feedback screen telling them how they've done.

The app is free to download – just search White Rose Maths 1 minute maths!
