We hope you enjoyed your Spring break. Our topic this term is 'Animals.'

Literacy

We will be looking at a range of stories with an animal theme such as; Monkey Puzzle, Castor and Pollux and Farmer Duck. We will also look at how to take care of animals in non-fiction.

We will be continuing our Read, Write Inc groups. You can support this at home by reading with your child and talking about the pictures in books and predicting what may happen next.

Understanding the World

We will be looking at developing and understanding of growth and showing care and concern for living things in the environment.

Communication and Language

We encourage children to expand on their sentences and use describing words such as the colour and texture. We promote the children to work together in talk partners and to share their experiences.

Expressive Art and Design

Using a variety of media we will be making 'Animals' themed works of art to display around our nursery.

Maths

We will be taking part in the Maths Passport
Scheme within our school to work on our
number skills as well as having opportunities to
