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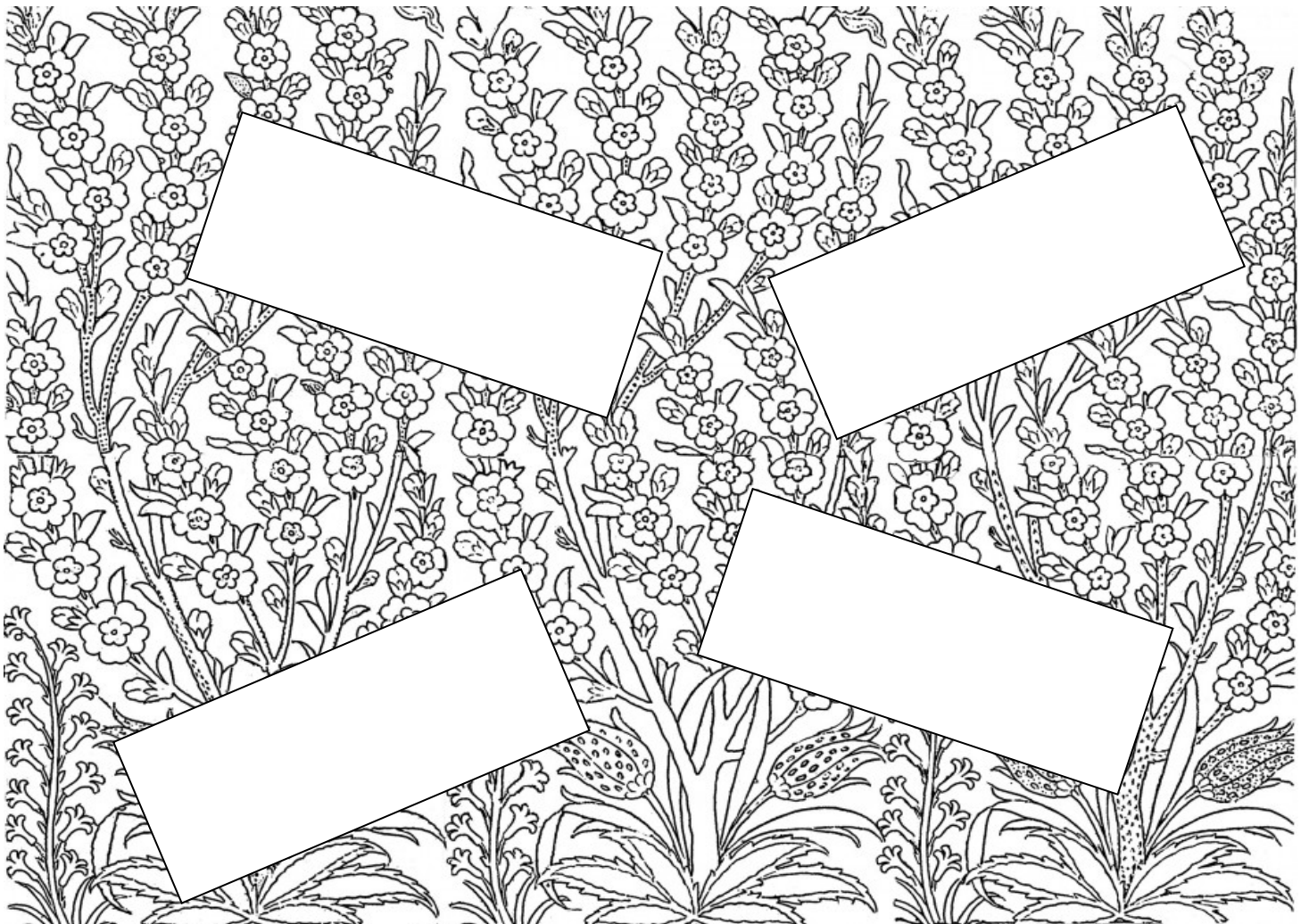
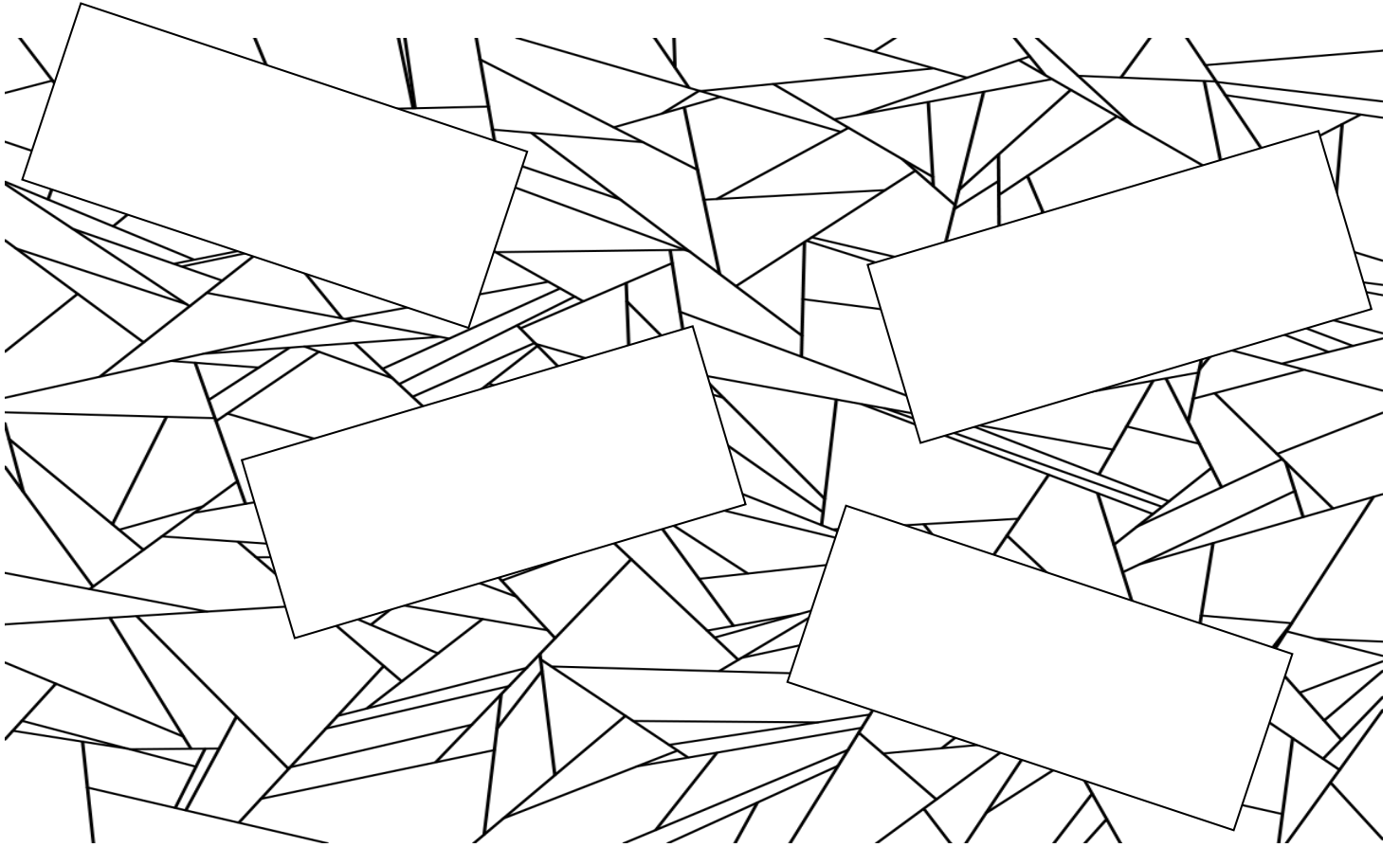
Use words from both the Year 5 / Year 6 spelling list and any other spellings from class that you may find a little tricky or need a little more practise with.	
1	<p style="text-align: center;">Make a mnemonic</p> <p>Pick some words and write your own mnemonic to remember the spelling. Here are some examples below: forty – four oranges rolled towards you yacht – yellow animals can't hide tomatoes necessary – never eat crisps eat salad sandwiches and remain young</p>
2	<p style="text-align: center;">Saying out spelling</p> <p>Pick some words and say them as you would spell them. bargain – bar - gain secretary – sec - ret - ary</p>
3	<p style="text-align: center;">Make a puzzle</p> <p>Make a word search with some words. or Make a crossword by looking up the words in a dictionary and using the definition as the clue.</p>
4	<p style="text-align: center;">Poster</p> <p>Think of a spelling rule and make a poster explaining the rule. Perhaps the border can be words that follow that rule.</p>
5	<p style="text-align: center;">Mindful colouring</p> <p>Write some words in the frames and colour the background. Once completed display them in places where you will see them regularly (e.g. the fridge door, bedroom mirror...).</p>
6	<p style="text-align: center;">Clued Spelling</p> <p>Using clues for the tricky bit e.g. necessary – one collar and two sleeves.</p>
7	<p style="text-align: center;">Connections</p> <p>Randomly pick two words and write them both in one sentence. My neighbour is a soldier. Then add another word into the sentence. How many can you add? My marvellous neighbour is a soldier.</p>
8	<p style="text-align: center;">Colourful Pens</p> <p>Write the word out three times, writing all the consonants in one colour and the vowels in another colour. Then write them out again but this time write each syllable in a different colour. Then write it out in as many different styles you can think of.</p>
9	<p style="text-align: center;">Pyramid</p> <p>Write out some words building a word pyramid. Which word will go on the bottom? Which will go on top? What other shapes can you make?</p>
10	<p style="text-align: center;">Beat the Clock</p> <p>Type the word on your tablet, phone or laptop with the stopwatch function open. Then type it again trying to beat your last time. What is the quickest time you can type the word? Challenge a friend to beat your time.</p>

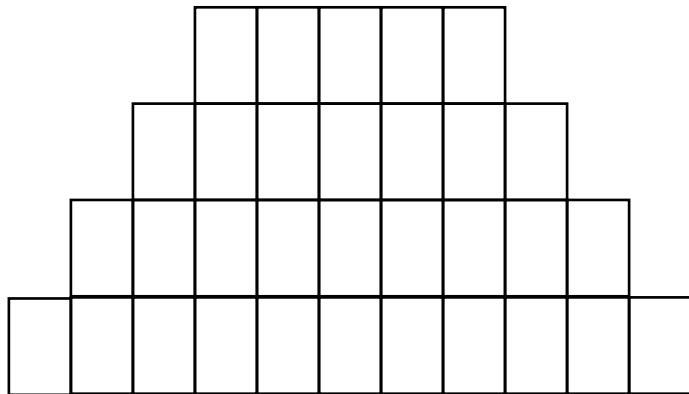
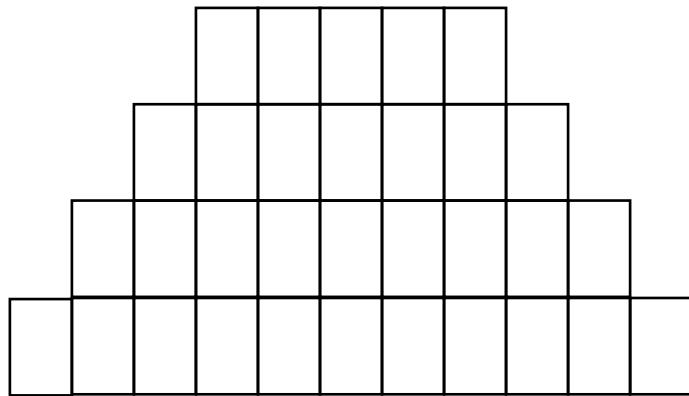
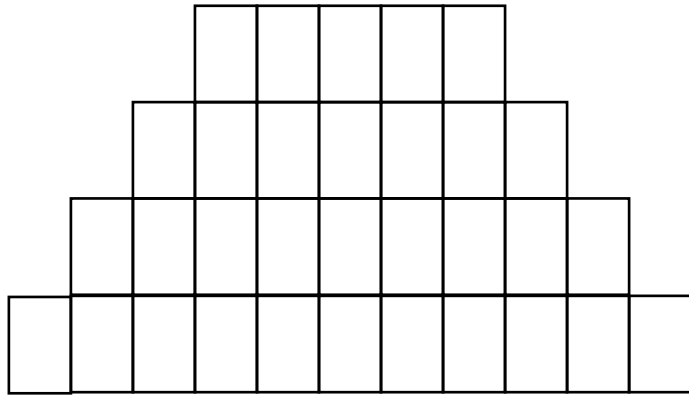
