We hope you enjoyed your Winter break. Our topic this term is 'Superhero.'

Literacy

We will be looking at a range of stories with a superhero theme such as; Super duck, Supertato, Super daisy and My super dad. We will also look at people who help us and explore a variety of non-fiction books such as 999 services.

We will be continuing our Read, Write Inc groups. You can support this at home by reading with your child and talking about the pictures in books and predicting what may happen next.

Understanding the World

We will be looking at real life superheroes. Who are our real life superheroes? We will be learning about different 999 services and people who help us in our daily life.

Communication and Language

We encourage children to expand on their sentences and use describing words such as the colour and texture. We promote the children to work together in talk partners and to share their experiences.

Expressive Art and Design

Using a variety of media we will be making 'superhero' themed works of art to display around our nursery.

Maths

We will begin to take part in the Maths
Passport Scheme within our school to work on
our number skills as well as having
opportunities to work on our mental maths
skills. Children will have individual targets to
work towards. Our main focus will be 2d/3d
shapes and recognising numbers to 10.

REMINDER

Please ensure you are reading with your child every night and asking them questions about the story. For example: how is the character feeling? What do you think is going to happen next?
