Questions 2, 5 and 8 (Varied Fluency)

Developing Identify the noun phrase and expanded noun phrase and the nouns within them in a single-clause sentence. Noun phrases are expanded with adjectives.

Expected Identify the noun phrase and expanded noun phrase and the nouns within them in a multi-clause sentence. Noun phrases are expanded with adjectives.

Greater Depth Identify the noun phrase and expanded noun phrase and the nouns within them in a multi-clause sentence. Noun phrases are expanded with adjectives, adverbs and/or prepositions.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Application and Reasoning)

Developing Find the expanded noun phrase to complete a single-clause sentence and explain why the alternatives are unsuitable. Noun phrases are expanded with adjectives.

Expected Find the expanded noun phrase to complete a multi-clause sentence and explain why the alternatives are unsuitable. Noun phrases are expanded with adjectives.

Greater Depth Find the expanded noun phrase to complete a multi-clause sentence and explain why the alternatives are unsuitable. Noun phrases are expanded with adjectives, adverbs and/or prepositions.
