Forthcoming Examinations for pupils in Years 6, 11, 12 and 13

The many recent changes to national examination and qualification frameworks affect all pupils in Year 6, 11, 12 and 13 and it is important to know precisely how well your child is progressing. I hope you will be able to join staff for the parent evenings and events for your child scheduled during the spring and summer terms (please find full details published on the website).

Mock exams were held in November for all Year 11 and Post 16 students - there will be further mock exams for all subjects in January. It is essential that Year 11-13 students develop a frequent and regular programme of personal study and revision: this should include a programme of independent study and practice during the Christmas holiday period. Should any further details or information be required in order to support your child at home, please contact members of staff at the Academy at any time.

The **Year 8 Parents Evening and Option Pathways Information Evening** is taking place on **Thursday 17th January at 6.00pm** and staff look forward to welcoming all Year 8 parents into the Academy on that day. End of Term Arrangements

In recognition of pupils' hard work and effort **All Academy Pupils** are invited to wear a **Christmas jumper and/or a Christmas hat on Friday 14**th **December.** By doing so we will all be supporting the national **Save the Children Christmas Jumper Day.** As the national advertisement tells us 'just stick on a silly sweater and donate to save children's lives'. Farewell

This is my final term in post as CEO and Principal. The past five years have travelled very quickly indeed. I have enjoyed my time at ARA immensely and will take with me many fond memories of the Academy and all of the pupils, families and members of staff associated with our primary and secondary schools.

I am delighted by the achievements of our pupils and staff. By working hard together over the years, we have seen the Academy grow to become a very popular choice of primary and secondary education for families in Ealing. Staff commitment extends well beyond the school day to provide a wide range of community sports and activities during the evenings, weekends and school holidays. It has been a great pleasure to be part of such a thriving learning community.

ARA pupils have celebrated excellent SATs, GCSE and A Level examination results. I have also taken immense pride in the achievements in the graduation of our adult learners for their Foundation and Bachelor of Arts Degrees accredited by Worchester University.

There have been two Ofsted inspections of the Academy during the past five years. Firstly in 2015 and again in June 2018. Pupils captured so effectively our aims and purpose when they told inspectors about the sense of togetherness they feel across the Academy: 'teachers make sure no one is left behind' and 'everyone looks out for each other'. The inspectors described the Academy as inclusive school 'that is demonstrated in the way pupils show respect for each other...this results in a united school community where the core values of kindness, respect and honesty are shown in all aspects of school life'. These are the traits for success and the outcomes of a committed, shared endeavour: a strong sense of values and shared purpose coupled with excellent academic outcomes across all age groups and phases of the school.

I am immensely proud of our Academy, our staff and our students and I shall leave ARA with an overwhelming gratitude for the privilege that it has been to share these years with ARA's history.
