Primary PE Sports Grant 2016/17

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013/14, 2014/15 and 2015/16 to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, with money going directly to primary school Head Teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

The grant must be spent on improving the provision of PE and sport for the benefit of pupils so that they develop healthy lifestyles.
