

Year 3 How Does Music Bring Us Together?



Key C Major, find the beat and have fun with the beat, Copy back clapping – long and short.

Key and Scale – C major, recognise and move to a steady beat 4/4, listen and copy rhythmic patterns.

Star Vocabulary

Musical Style: the genre of the music. A specific type of music -for example: Reggae or Jazz.

Key: A system of related chords and notes from the major or minor scale with one central note. For example, the key of C

Tempo: the speed at which a piece of music should be played. For example, allegro means quick and lively.

Time Signature: this tells you how many beats there are in a bar.

Beat: the steady pulse you feel in a piece of music.

Meter: when beats are combined into groups.

- To understand the key and scale of G Major – G, A, B, C, D, E, F#, G
- Find the beat – recognise and move to a steady beat in a 4/4 meter.
- Copy Back Clapping – Listen and Copy Rhythmic patterns made of minims, crotchets, quavers and rests, by ear or by notation.
