Runt an animal that is small compared to the others, or the weakest and smallest of a litter

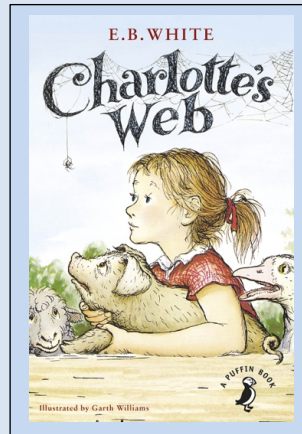
Dejected sad and depressed

Context

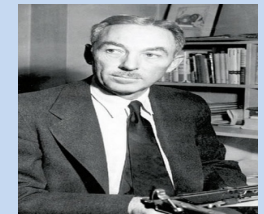
Set on a very mundane and ordinary farm around 1930-1950. The book is based on friendship, loyalty and determination.

Key characters

Wilbur the main character – starts off small

Charlotte a web building spider who is the mother figure to Wilbur

Fern Arable A little girl who saves Wilbur from an untimely death

Mr Zukerman Fern's uncle

Templeton A rat who helps Charlotte to save Wilbur
