### Facts

- Christians believe that Jesus is the Son of God. They believe that he was both fully human and fully God. The Bible tells Christians that Jesus came to Earth to save people from all the bad things they do. While he was on Earth, he told people about God and how He wanted them to live their lives.
- Jesus was crucified on a cross but Christians believe that he defeated death and rose from the dead. This is why they celebrate at Easter.
- Lent is actually 46 days, however the six Sundays are excluded because there is no obligation to fast on Sundays in Lent.

### Star Vocabulary

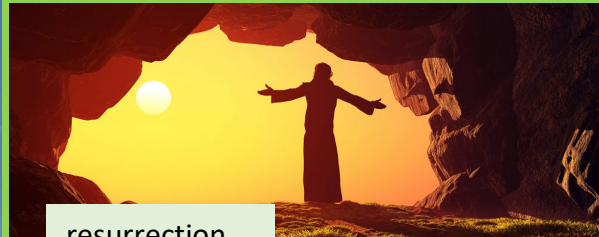
<b><u>Eucharist:</u></b>	a ceremony remembering Jesus' the last supper.
<b><u>Crucifixion:</u></b>	An ancient form of execution in which a person was nailed or bound to a cross.
<b><u>Resurrection:</u></b>	the rising of Christ from the dead.
<b><u>Salvation:</u></b>	release from sin and its consequences, believed by Christians to be brought about by faith in Christ
<b><u>Redemption:</u></b>	the action of saving or being saved from sin, error, or evil.
