
<u>Star vocabulary</u>	
Sight	Your eyes let you see all the things around you.
Hearing	Your ears let you listen to all the things around you.
Touch	Your skin gives you the sense of touch. You will know what things feel like.
Taste	Your sense of taste comes from your tongue. You can tell if something tastes bitter or sweet.
Smell	You smell using your nose. Your nose can tell if things smell nice or not nice.
Body parts	Our body is made up of different parts and they all have different jobs.
