Musical Style: A specific type of music, for

example: Blues or Jazz.

Pulse: the regular h eartbeat of the music,

its steady beat.

Pitch: high and low sounds.

Rhythm: long and short sounds or patterns that happen over the pulse.

Compose: To create and develop musical

ideas.

Improvise: To make up a tune and play it

on the spot.

Perform: To sing and play instruments for

others to hear.

Groove: The rhythmic part of the music that makes you want to move and dance.
