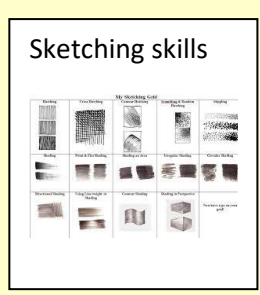
What is Landscape art? Landscapes are works of art that feature scenes of nature. This includes mountains, lakes, gardens, rivers, and any scenic view. Landscapes can be oil paintings, watercolours, gouache, pastels, or prints of any kind.

Origin: Derived from the Dutch word *landschap*, landscape paintings capture the natural world around us.

Format: "Landscape format" refers to a picture plane that has a width which is greater than its height. Essentially, it is a piece of art in a horizontal rather than a vertical orientation.


Painting skills:

- Underpainting. It's important to never work from white when using oils or acrylics. Create an underpainting in burnt...
- Blotting. Brushes come in a number of shapes and with different fibre types, all of which give very different...
- Building up texture. Have a dry flat brush that you can use to blend your paint - create smooth transitions.
- Dry brushing. This is a method of applying colour that only partially covers a previously dried layer of paint. Add...
