Detached House	A house that is by itself.
Semi detached House	2 houses that are joint together in the middle.
Terraced House	Houses that are joint together and there are lots of houses in a row.
Flats	A tall building full of homes.
Bungalow	House on one level without an upstairs.
Mobile houses	Houses that can be moved.
House boats	Homes on boats that travel along water.

### Key Facts

Homes have existed for thousands of years. They were made out of materials that were available at the time.



In 1215, most people lived in houses with stone walls and straw roofs.

In the past, rich people lived in castles.



In 1524, brick and glass was expensive. Houses made out of these materials were for the rich people.



Victorian houses are very detailed and many houses nowadays have Victorian features.

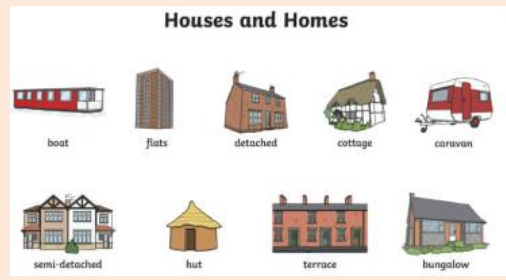
### Types of Houses

The main part of the house is built with bricks. Bricks are made from clay.

These windows have panes made of glass. The frames are not made of wood. Instead, they are made of uPVC, which is a special type of plastic.
